****Students must earn 5 out of 7 checks from the items listed below for each project to receive a passing score.***

OPTION 1

BLOG – on EDMODO see instructions attached

- ___ Blog entry shows evidence of preparation (see example on EDMODO).
- ___ Fiction: Blog entry includes the title, author, characters and summary. 3 paragraphs
- ___ Nonfiction: Blog entry includes the title, author, main ideas and interesting facts. 3 paragraphs
- ___ Blog entry includes your opinion, recommendation, & response (minimum 5 sentences) to 2 H.O.T. questions.

- Higher-Order Thinking questions. (H.O.T.questions)

FICTION

1. Would this book make a good TV show? Why or why not?
2. How is the main character the same or different from you?
3. What other books or stories might you compare to this book?
Tell about the similarities/differences?
4. Would you change the ending of this book? Why or why not?

NON-FICTION

1. How is the subject like another you have read?
2. If you were to write a book on the same topic, how would you present it? (In a new fashion, different emphasis or viewpoint.)
3. Have a dinner party for this person. Who would you invite (at least two other people) that this person would enjoy spending time with? Why did you choose them?
4. Does this subject make you aware of any problems that need attention? What would you do about the problem?

- ___ Blog entry has few errors in grammar and spelling.
- ___ Student responded thoughtfully to at least 1 fellow student's blog entry. minimum 5 sentences
- ___ A key quote or excerpt from the text is present in the blog entry.
- ___ Blog entry proves connections were made with the book read.

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OPTION 2

BOOK REPORT IN A BAG

- Oral presentation states the author's name and the title of the book.
- Oral presentation gives a summary:
 - Fiction: Plot, main characters, setting and events from the book shared.
 - Nonfiction: Main ideas and interesting facts from the book shared.
- Shares reactions, and explains why you recommend the book.
- Bag includes all necessary parts from attached directions and few grammar or spelling errors.
- Presentation is enthusiastic and grabs the audience's attention.
- Shares a connection made with the book.
- Presents with appropriate eye contact and voice.

OPTION 3

SCRAPBOOK PAGE

- Product includes your name, title and the author of the book.
- Product includes pictures/drawings relating to the book.
- Product includes: Fiction: Main characters and events from the book. Minimum 3 paragraphs
Nonfiction: Main ideas and interesting facts from the book. Minimum 3 paragraphs
- Product is neat and organized showing pre-planning.
- A key quote from the book is used in the product
- Product includes opinion and recommendation.
- Few errors in grammar or spelling

OPTION 4

BOOK TRAILER – attach file to EDMODO, save on flashdrive or DVD, use iMovie, WeVideo, Keynote or Power Point, or other movie app

- The movie trailer presents the student's name and the title and author of the book.
- The movie trailer "hooks" the audience in to the book.
- Fiction: The movie trailer includes a summary of the book, at least 1 paragraph, which does not give away the ending. The summary may be typed into the video OR done as a voiceover. Also includes a credits page.
 - Nonfiction: The movie trailer includes main ideas and interesting facts from the book. (1 or more paragraphs) Also includes credits page.
- The movie trailer has 5 clips/ frames (minimum) which are clear and relate to the book. Clips may be still pictures or video clips.
- The movie trailer includes appropriate background music and visuals.
- Has few grammar and spelling errors.
- Is 1-3 minutes in length.

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
